





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1.0 BACKGROUND


Tanganyika became independent on 9th December, 1961 and a Republic in 1962. Zanzibar became independent on 10th December, 1963 and the People's Republic of Zanzibar was established after the Revolution of 12th January, 1964. The two sovereign states formed the United Republic of Tanzania on 26th April, 1964.

The general election held in October, 2015 brought to power His Excellency Dr. John Pombe Joseph Magufuli from Chama Cha Mapinduzi (CCM) as the fifth President of the United Republic of Tanzania for the next five-year term.

Dodoma is the capital city and Dar es Salaam is the major commercial city. The official currency is the Tanzanian Shilling (TZS) and the national language is Kiswahili, but English is also widely used.

2.0 GEOGRAPHY



The population of Tanzania has increased almost four times from 12.3 million in 1967 to 48.8 million in 2015. The total fertility rate according to the 2012 Population and Housing Census is 5.5














