WHAT ARE BELGIANS DOING IN EAST AFRICA?

The African Development Bank (AfDB) has approved the conversion of the Africa Climate Change Fund (ACCF) to a multi-donor trust fund bringing the governments of Italy and Flanders (Belgium), who are contributing €4.7 million (\$5 million) and €2 million (\$2 million), respectively to the fund. https://www.afdb.org/en/news-and-events/africa-climate-change-fund-scales-up-its-operations-with-new-contributions-from-italy-and-flanders-16818/

IN A GLANCE

The World Bank has announced a \$ 57 billion (Sh5.7 Trillion) Financing for Sub Saharan Africa, the bulk of which will be used for development. (The Standard)

The upgrade of a 118 km road section connecting **Kenya** and **Uganda** has gathered momentum after the African Development Bank Group (AFDB) approved **Sh26.1 billion** (\$253 million) for the project. (Business Daily)

KENYA

Chinese Mining firm Chuanshan will invest **\$40 million** in exploration and mining of Diatomite at Marigat in Kenya's Baringo County. (The East African)

The European Investment Bank (EIB) will fund new projects in the power and transport sectors to the tune of **60million euros (Sh6.7 billion).** (The Standard)

Sh1.3 billion will be spent to equip over 6,500 youth in marginalized areas with vocational skills at the coast. They will be done together by the European Union, Kenya Red Cross Society, The Aga Khan Foundation, GIZ and representatives from the national government. (Daily Nation)

The government has signed a **Sh18billion** deal with two Chinese firms to rehabilitate 206km of roads in South Nyanza. Kenya National Highways Authority (KENHA), with the support of the African Development Bank is set to roll out rehabilitation of the road. (The Standard)

Counties will receive **Sh19.1 billion** annually for five years to advance reproductive, maternal neonatal, child and adolescent healthcare. World Bank will fund **Sh15 billion** while **4 billion** will be provided by the **Global Financing Trust Fund** and 10 million by a **Japanese Government Grant**.

Some 300,000 more homes will be connected to the power Grid at subsided rates after Kenya received a Sh 20 billion support from the European lenders.

The Global Fund has set aside Sh6 billion for 15 million free mosquito nets to malaria prone counties in Kenya.

The International Finance Corporation (IFC) says it is willing to make an additional investment of up to \$60 million (SH6billion) insurance group Britam in the next 12 months. (Business Daily)

Turin Based Iveco has returned to Kenya through Global Motors Centre which is building a **Sh2.3 billion** assembly plant in Mombasa to produce the Italian automaker's range of Commercial Vehicle brands. (Business Daily)

French billionaire businessman Mohed Altrad has donated 3,000 books worth **Sh5million** to Mount Kenya University (MKU) (Business Daily)

UK will donate Sh500 million to support Kenya's effort mitigating the effects of the current drought, (The Star)

Kenyan government has approved **Sh6.7 billion** (\$65 million) towards the country's last mile connectivity project. The loan signed with European Investment Bank (EIB) concerns a multiple scheme electrification project, targeting universal access to electricity for the Kenyan population by 2020, the Standard reported. https://www.esi-africa.com/news/kenya-rural-electrification-project-obtains-funding/

TANZANIA

Prime Cement has signed a deal with Denmark's FLSmidth to build a **US\$65m** cement grinding plant in Musanze District. The plant will have a cement production capacity of 0.7Mt/yr.
