IN A GLANCE

The European Investment Bank (EIB) has signed a \$25 million financing plan for the installation of off-grid solar systems, to strengthen energy access in Africa.

DL Koisagat Tea Company Ltd, a Kenyan firm, has acquired five tea factories in Tanzania form a British Company at a cost of **\$60 million** (The East African)

East African Finance ministers, AFDB agree to bridge **\$170 billion infrastructure funding** to keep pace with the region's youth population, create jobs and safeguard peace. (The East African)

KENYA

Counties will receive **Sh2 billion** for building, equipping and renovating polytechnics in order to absorb Form Four leavers who fail to join universities. https://allafrica.com/stories/201804050214.html

The **International Finance Corporation (IFC)** will invest an additional **\$97 million** in National Cement in the form of debt and equity to help fund the construction of new plants. (Daily Nation)

Kenya Pipeline Company plans to build facilities worth \$125 million to handle and store Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) to boost cooking gas-use in the rapidly urbanising nation. (The Standard)

The Government has signed a loan agreement with Japan for Olkaria1, 2 and 3 geothermal power rehabilitation projects amounting to **Sh9.53 billion** (my Gov Weekly)

Diamond Trust Bank (DTB) has set sights on increased lending to the SMEs after securing a \$75 million loan from the AFDB for onward lending to small businesses. (Business Daily)

A Sh1.6 billion sewer and water project financed by the AFDB and Kenya Government whose construction will kick off in 2 months to improve the health status of Kirinyaga Residents.

IFC is set to lend Kikuyu-based pharmaceutical manufacturer Universal Corporation Limited \$10 Million (Sh1 billion) to help increase its output and introduce new products. (Daily Nation)

Kenya will over the next 6 months have access to a **\$1.5 billion** precautionary facility in case the economy encounters unforeseen shocks which were approved by the IMF executive board.

The fight against Female Genital mutilation in Samburu and Marsabit counties got a boost after Amref and USAID launched a **Sh372.5** million project meant to curb the practice. (Business Daily)

The government has launched a **Sh981 million** project in a bid to tackle the water shortage problem in Siaya County. (Business Daily)

Coffee farmers have received a boost after Baringo county government signed a **\$Sh100 million** deal with the Korean NGO World Best Friend for the construction of a milling plant. (Business Daily)

TANZANIA

Graphex mining ltd has raised **\$2.45 million** in placement of **8.7 million** shares to fund Chilalo graphite project in Southeast Tanzania (The East African)

AB-INBEV NV, the world's largest brewer, is planning to build a \$100 million brewery in Dodoma, Tanzania (East African)

UGANDA

Three Indian firms have expressed interest to invest more than \$600 million in Uganda's energy and mineral sectors. (Business Daily)

Uganda has signed an agreement with consortium of American and Italian firms to finance construct and operate its **\$4 billion refinery** in Hoima district. (The East African)

ETHIOPIA

Japan has given a **27.5 million dollars** grant to Ethiopia for the construction of the Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD) human resource development centre with four-storey and a basement intended to assist in Kaizen. https://allafrica.com/stories/201804030133.html

The World Bank agreed a **Sh60.5** (\$600m) loan and grant to Ethiopia to fund roads and other infrastructure projects in urban areas. (Business Daily)
