## **KENYA**

Focused on Nature (FON) is an organization founded by prince Hussain Aga Khan to assist in the conversation protection of threatened and endangered species and habitat conservation. The government has launched programme to improve productivity in the Dairy sector in 21 counties. The programme dubbed Dairy value Chain platform is financed by the **World Bank** with **\$219 million** (Sh21billion)

**Cytonn Investment management Plc** has reached a deal with mid-tier **SBM Bank** Kenya for a **Sh650 million** loan signalling a plan to diversity its **funding** sources. (Business Daily)

Kenya will benefit from a (\$38 million) fund by the Coca- Cola Company to stimulate plastic recycling. The Initiative aims at creating awareness on plastic waste pollution over the next three years. (The Standard)

The Northern region is set to open up for more Investment after the **European Union (EU)** gave grants worth **Sh402 million** to Northern Rangelands Trust (NRT) conservancies for infra structural development. The high-grade infrastructural Equipment donated will facilitate construction of 21 airstrips within 39 community conservancies and open up internal roads to boost tourism, security, economy, livelihoods together with the conservation of nature and wildlife across 10 counties. <a href="https://allafrica.com/stories/201903180116.html">https://allafrica.com/stories/201903180116.html</a>

The government is negotiating with China for a loan of about **Sh370 billion** to complete the third phase of the standard gauge railway. According to Kenya railways Acting Director Philip Mahinga, the corporation is also holding talks to finance a system that will ensure the railway, its passengers, goods and equipment are secure as they snake through sparsely populated regions in its 974-kilometre journey from Mombasa to Malaba in Busia County. <a href="https://allafrica.com/stories/201903200401.html">https://allafrica.com/stories/201903200401.html</a>.

#### **UGANDA**

Kikagati hydropower project in Uganda has received **US \$27M** funding from the <u>Emerging Africa Infrastructure</u> Fund (EAIF). Government signed a multi-billion deal with the China Railway Seventh Group to design and construct Masindi-Biso, Kabaale-Kizirafumbi and Hohwa-Nyairongo-Kyarushesha-Butole road.
